### How the Year 7 Catch-Up Premium was spent in 2015-2016

#### Objectives

To support the attainment of year 7 pupils to support their progression in English and maths.

#### Summary of Spending

Cover time for the literacy coordinator to conduct reading tests on a 1:1 basis to identify intervention strategies

Purchase of Numicon resources and additional training for all staff to support the needs of low ability students

#### Interventions

During the Autumn Term 2015 a teacher was timetabled to support maths and literacy intervention for identified students on a daily basis to intensively support learning.

#### How will we improve the attainment of those remaining below level 4?

All pupils at Pitcheroak School have a statement of special educational need or an Educational Health Care Plan and all students are working below level 4 in English and maths therefore the school uses an assessment tool called B Squared that tracks progress in these subjects. We therefore believe a more realistic target is 2 sub levels of progress relative to their academic level.

<b>Planned Use of the Year 7 Catch-Up Premium 2016-2017</b>
<p>Interventions will continue in English and maths with new learning mentors who will commence their roles on April 11<sup>th</sup> 2016. The Deputy Head responsible for data tracking will identify students from year 7 that require additional 1:1 support in reading, writing and basic numeracy. Those students will work intensively with the learning mentors to improve their academic attainment.</p>
